

Foster Care: When I was 7 years old, I went into foster care in Caerphilly with my brother who was 14. This was not a good experience as that time, both me and my brother were grieving over my Dad passing away. I was at this placement for 5 years.....it wasn't very positive at all. I felt like I wasn't important nor was I listened to. I felt all they cared about was the money. I was constantly being accused of things that I hadn't done. I felt that I couldn't speak up because I knew nothing would be done about it and I may have got into trouble for that.

5 years later I moved into a nice foster home – it was nice because I knew the people as I had been there with them for respite in the past. I told them I did not want to go back to Caerphilly and they listened to me - I was then moved into Barry and was very happy.

Adult Placement: My first placement was awful. This is because the host was taking my money, leaving me on my own with her daughter that had severe mental health issues and she used to expect me to do all the housework as well as take care of her dogs. I told Vale PF about this and they blew the whistle on the carer. Within 24 hours I was moved into an emergency respite placement where I stayed for a year. It was wonderful, they were a warm, loving family that had my best wishes at heart. Very person-centred and took their role as a Shared Lives host very seriously.

Have a laugh – be human!

Give us the RIGHT information

Reassure us if we need it
